EB Meeting Minutes	Last month's meeting minutes were approved.				
President's Report (CM)	3 Bridges 204 people checked in, but probably some people were missed. 176 checked in for the Final 10, but that's also probably a low number. 3 Bridges #2 - stuck with traditional route, Tim Decker proposed we try something new, a 5-bridges run. We aim to test that proposal during the winter. There was some debate over the 3 Bridges route, lots of turns, need to make sure it's safe, want to hear from multiple groups. Brad does a great job. Updated the medical kits b/c a few people fell, fortunately they are on the mend. No reports of falls on the Last 10 run as we avoided				

	the cobblestones on the west side of 5 <sup>th</sup> Avenue.  New members run took place in the middle of September. Five new members showed up. Carla wants to keep it going.  MB- asked if anything we can do to prevent falls: We changed route on the final 10 to avoid cobblestones (which are in the process of being repaired)  Also will do more to flag a stretch in Brooklyn where the ground is very uneven. Agreed that the change for Final 10 was a good one.  -Meet the Candidates/ Volunteer Appreciation event scheduled for Nov. 21.  -Many bib requests for NYRR Ted Corbitt raceWill begin discussions with Amy Sitar on MTP and Speedpass for 2025.	
Treasurer's Report (NT)	-Third consecutive profitable month. 534 members in Heylo who have actively set up accounts \$2.3K net profit for September.  Membership- 39 new, 50 Renewal, 9 cancellations. Cleaning up database, somehow a few people are signing up for memberships without paying, but working to fix.  Lots more competition for our long runs.  Looking to reduce IT costs this year- members involved with the web site (Neil, Chris, Marc, Ed, Ray) will meet to discuss whether we still need the help of the IT professional.  Coach revenue goes directly to coaches, unlike the past, so hard to compare year over year – but no more swings, we get a truer monthly p/l statement.  October will also be a profitable month.  Bank balance stable, potential opportunities to use it to subsize events.  Don't need to increase dues  Strong renewal fees in Sept next year bundling 3 bridges run may attract even more interest.	
Awards Committee	David Gains joined us to review the recent revision to the awards guidelines.  -David has been on the awards committee since 2018. Last time the rules were reviewed was 2018, and parts were hard to interpret because of various changes over time. In the spring the rules were revised and the Awards Committee approved.
